Comments on the Master's thesis:

In his master thesis, student Mohammad Shaqib Saifi focuses on sieve analysis of rubber particles obtained from rubber waste. In the Theoretical part, the chapters dealing with issue of rubber recycling are mainly discussed. Then follows the Experimental part, including the Purpose of the work / Material / Methodology / Results and discussion. The entire work is summarized in the conclusion.

As Mohammad's supervisor, I have to admit that he was interested in the topic and worked relatively independently. On the other hand, the general quality of the work (typography, deeper discussion of the results, and the like) could have been higher if he had paid more attention to it and had been more precise. Perhaps, his lack of experience with such kind of work had to some extent get him off on a little wrong foot.

In any case, I think that the thesis submitted meets the basic criteria for this type of work. I recommend it being accepted to the successful defence of the master thesis, and I assess the grade: C - good.
